The Department of Radiation Oncology at U.C. Irvine is seeking a physician scientist who will develop an active translational research program in cancer biology/radiation oncology. The appointment will be in the state-funded, in-line tenure track series. The candidate should be a board certified radiation oncologist with significant research experience in molecular and cellular biology. A track record of independent grant funded research is highly desirable and the successful applicant will be expected to compete for external peer-reviewed funding. Significant protected research time and start-up funds will be provided. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to become a member of the NCI-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center at U. C. Irvine and participate in both basic science and clinical oncology research programs. There are ongoing programs in carcinogenesis, virology, structural biology, growth factors and signaling, molecular genetics of cancer, photomedicine, epidemiology, chemoprevention and clinical oncology. The applicant must be a U.S. citizen or possess permanent visa status.

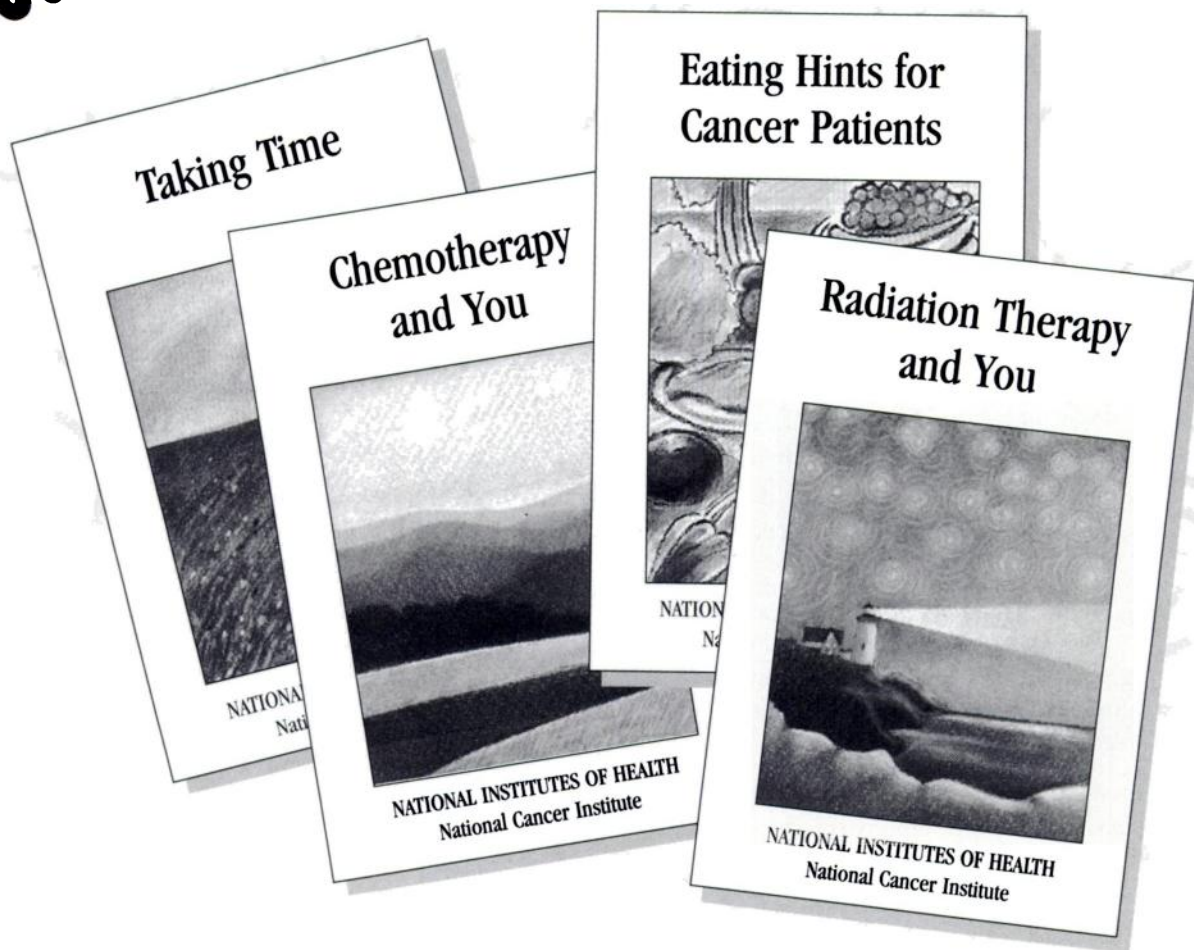
